ASL Program Description

Utah Tech University's American Sign Language emphasis program is unique in southern Utah. In addition to language acquisition classes, students take classes in Deaf Culture. Students learn crucial communication skills such as cultural awareness and sensitivity, register and code switching, and the ability to be lifelong learners. Furthermore, they develop cultural and linguistic knowledge to navigate various social, professional and educational environments as cultural and linguistic liaisons.

PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE/CERTIFICATION (PLC) REQUIREMENTS

The curriculum for programs at Utah Tech University customarily leading to licensure have been designed to meet the educational licensure/ certification requirements in Utah as well as to prepare students to apply for licensure exams in the State of Utah.
